INTRODUCTION

The Believe in Youth-Louisiana 2.0 (BY-LA 2.0) program offers trauma-informed, evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention programming throughout Southeast Louisiana. During the first two years of BY-LA 2.0, the program encountered setbacks from COVID-19, virtual learning, and Hurricane Ida. Throughout these circumstances, the program managed to meet significant milestones and offer high-quality instruction to the youth served.

METHODS

- 1. Materials for BY-LA 2.0 were digitized for virtual implementation, including consent forms, curricula, workbooks, and activities.
- 2. One-hour presentations (OHPs) were offered for schools and partners that needed the content but could not immediately commit to full programming due to COVID-19 limitations.
- 3. BY-LA 2.0 staff consistently communicated with school partners and community organizations throughout the pandemic and Hurricane Ida recovery periods to meet immediate needs.
